Celebrating Sixty Years of Vocal Excellence The 2004 Convention—*Singing and All That Jazz* July 8-12, New Orleans

Sixty years ago, our Association was founded with the express purpose of encouraging "the highest standards of the vocal art and of ethical principles in the teaching of singing; and to promote vocal education and research at all levels, both for the enrichment of the general public and for the professional advancement of the talented." Nothing we do exemplifies the purpose more than what takes place when we gather every two years for our Biennial Convention.

Last July, then President William McIver, President Elect Jane Dillard, and I met with a very enthusiastic Local Convention Committee to hear their plans for what is shaping up to be a truly outstanding and enjoyable time in the Big Easy. Nita Herrick, the Convention Chair, has put together an extremely able committee of workers: Scharmal Schrock, Program Chair; Jon Secrest, Academic Papers; Michele Martin, Registrar; W. Loraine Sims, Exhibits and Advertising Coordinator; Philip Frohnmayer, Local NATSAA Coordinator; and Michael Williams, Hospitality Chair. We came away from that meeting with a very positive impression about what will take place in New Orleans, July 8-12.

New Orleans is a great city for a Convention. You can feel comfortable bringing the whole family. There is a lot to interest anyone—a great zoo; Audubon Park; the Audubon Aquarium of the Americas; the National D-Day Museum; Canal Street and the French Quarter; Swamp Boat Rides; tours of old Southern Mansions; the great New Orleans cuisine; and Harrah's Casino. You can enjoy Convention rates at the Sheraton Hotel three days before and three days after the Convention.

In 2002, President Delp appointed a committee to study our Convention offerings. Jane Dillard chaired this committee. Their report played a big role in some changes in the Convention Program we know you will appreciate. One of the innovations this year is a Pre-Convention Session on the Male High Voice. It was one of William McIver's dreams to have a concentrated mini-workshop on some relevant pedagogical topic. He suggested the topic and asked

Dr. Stephen Austin to plan the sessions on July 7 and 8. Master teachers will work with young men "observed lessons" where they will demonstrate voicebuilding methods. Guest master teachers will include Dale Moore, Karen Peeler and moderator Stephen F. Austin.



Nita Herrick promises a "wide variety of topics dealing with a broad spectrum of issues covering classical singing and the many forms of commercial music." Jennifer Larmore is the Convention Artist. Her featured Recital will take place in the historic Orpheum Theater on Sunday afternoon, July 11, and she and her pianist will present a Master Class on French Mélodie on the Final day of the Convention. Other recitalists includeTimothy Noble and the 2002 NATSAA Winner, Kara Guggenmos. Along with Jennifer Larmore, other Master Classes will feature Craig Carnelia, Barbara Conable, and Constance Cuccaro. Ron Scherer and Ingo Titze will be the featured presenters in the Voice Science Advisory Committee Sessions. As always, the 2004 NATS Artist Awards Competition will be an integral part of the Convention, as will the Art Song Competition. Donald Simonson has planned another stimulating array of Poster Sessions. We will have one of the largest Exhibits ever at this Convention. An early opening evening kick-off to the Exhibits will give everyone a chance to preview the offerings of all exhibitors. Many other NATS luminaries will be featured in Specialized Class Sessions.

You will receive a brochure outlining the offerings and registration information, or you can go online at www.nats.org and register. I hope you will join us in New Orleans for this outstanding event.



William W. McIver 1942-2003

IN MEMORIAM

Dr. William W. McIver, passed away on September 15, 2003. He is survived by his wife Dana and sons Matthew and Jonathan, brother Dr. Robert McIver and his wife Karen, sister Kay Reilly, bother-in-law Dr. Dale Weigel and his wife Ulrike and many beloved nieces and nephews.

Dr. McIver was born in Williamsport, Pennsylvania and at age 9 auditioned for the title role in *Amahl and the Night Visitors* by Gian-Carlo Menotti. He won the role and performed the opera live on NBC television from 1952-1955 and performed Ignolde in Debussy's *Pelleas and Melisande* at the New York City Opera. Despite his performing success, at the age of 10 he knew he wanted to teach.

He received degrees from Oberlin Conservatory and College, where his chief mentor was professor of voice and noted author Richard Miller. William earned a Master's in Music at the University of Illinois and his Doctorate of Musical Arts from West Virginia University. He taught at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro for 29 years, where he was the chairman of the voice department for eight years. He also served as Music Director and then as Chancel Choir Director at the First Lutheran Church in Greensboro for over 20 years.

In 1998 Dr. McIver joined the faculty of the Eastman School of Music and established the graduate program in vocal pedagogy. He served the National Association of Teachers of Singing in many capacities, from the local level to the National Presidency. He was also a member of the Music Teachers National Association, where he served on the Pedagogy and Editorial Committees.

He will be remembered by everyone for his passion for music, sport, food and family. Music was a fundamental part of his life and he loved sharing his passion. He will be greatly missed by NATS and all those who loved him.

Jennifer Larmore's operatic début in 1986 as 'Sesto' in Mozart's La clemenza di Tito in France marked the start of a brilliant international career in which operas of Rossini, Bellini, Mozart and Handel have come to figure prominently. She has appeared in her signature role 'Rosina' from II barbiere di Siviglia to extraordinary acclaim in Paris, Amsterdam, Bonn, Berlin, Buenos Aires, Bilbao, Milan, Vienna and London, It was this role that she chose for her Metropolitan Opera début in 1995. Miss Larmore was first heard at La Scala in Le Comte Ory, later returning for L'Enfant et les sortileges as well as II barbiere di Siviglia. She has appeared as 'Romeo' in I Capuleti e I Montecchi in Lisbon, Geneva, Paris and New York. Adding yet another Rossini heroine to her repertoire, Miss Larmore sang 'Isabella' in L'italiana in Algeri to equal success in Torino, Berlin, Buenos Aires, Vienna, New York and Paris. She made her Salzburg Festival début in 1993 as 'Dorabella' in Cosi fan tutte and her debut as 'Charlotte' in Massenet's Werther at the Klangbogen Festival in Vienna in 2000.

Miss Larmore's love of early music has allowed her to perform and record the role of 'Ottavia' from Monteverdi's L'Incoronazione di Poppea in Bologna, Montpellier and the Early Music Festival in Innsbruck, Austria. As a champion of the music of Handel. Miss Larmore has triumphed in the title role in Giulio Cesare in Amsterdam, Lisbon, Paris, Beaune, Berlin, Montreux and Brussels and in two seasons at the Metropolitan Opera in New York. Her definitive recording of this work on the Harmonia Mundi label was selected to receive the Grammophone Award for 'Best Baroque Opera of the Year'.

2004 NEW ORLEANS CONVENTION FEATURED ARTIST: JENNIFER LARMORE

Jennifer Larmore is equally at home on the concert stage with a wide-ranging repertory extending from Handel's Messiah and Vivaldi's Magnificat to Rossini's Stabat Mater and Mahler's Rückertlieder, which she has sung not only at the Vienna Musikverein with Riccardo Muti and the Vienna Philharmonic, but also at the Concertgebouw, Amsterdam with Donald Runnicles. Her recording of Berlioz' La Damnation de Faust, under the direction of Günther Neuhold on the Baver label was followed by performances with the Cleveland Orchestra under Christoph von Dohnanyi. She gave her debut with the New York Philharmonic under the direction of Kurt Masur with Mahler's Lied von der Erde, which she has also sung with the St Paul Chamber Orchestra and Andreas Delfs. She has performed Schoenberg's Gurrelieder with the Dresdner Staatskapelle under Giuseppe Sinopoli, and with the Pittsburgh Symphony under Mariss Jansons. Miss Larmore's Prague Spring Festival debut under Marco Guidarini was a wildly successful event.

Jennifer Larmore's prodigious discography now extends to nearly four-dozen recordings. Lucia di Lammermoor and Semiramide (the first of her five Grammy nominations) for Deutsche Grammophon. Monteverdi's L'Incoronazione di Poppea, Orfeo, Gulio Cesare, Mozart's Mass in C minor and 'Jennifer Larmore – A Portrait' for Harmonia Mundi. For RCA, 'The Faces of Love', a collection of songs by Jake Heggie.

In 1994 Miss Larmore signed an exclusive recording contract with Teldec Classics International. Her opera recordings for the Teldec label include *Il barbiere di Siviglia, La Cenerentola* and *L'italiana in Algeri, Orpheé, Carmen, Rigoletto* and *Hänsel and Gretel*.

Concert recordings include Stravinsky's *Pulcinella*, Durufle's *Requiem*, Schoenberg's *Gurrelieder* (with Sinopoli) and de Falla's *El amor brujo*. Her solo recordings include the Grammy nominated CD's of Handel and Mozart

arias, 'Where Shall I fly', 'Call Me Mister' and 'My Native Land', a collection of American songs with pianist Antoine Palloc. Jennifer Larmore was featured in the closing ceremonies of the 1996 Olympic games when she returned to her hometown of Atlanta, Georgia to sing the *Olympic Hymn*. Teldec celebrated this event with a portrait CD entitled 'Born in Atlanta', released in August 1996. Her latest release for Teldec, called 'L'Etoile', is a collection of French Opera Arias.

Miss Larmore's recent collaboration with the Korean soprano Hei-Kyung Hong for the Teldec label features a selection of popular operatic duets, entitled 'Bellezza Vocale', with the Scottish Chamber Orchestra conducted by Donald Runnicles. For the Arabesque label, Miss Larmore recorded Rossini songs, duets and quartets with John Aler and Arleen Auger. For the Opera Rara label, releases include Rossini's *Bianca e Falliero* and Pacini's *Carlo di Borgogna*, both under the direction of David Parry and the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment.

Recent engagements have included Miss Larmore's debut in the title roles of Carmen with Placido Domingo as Don José and La Cenerentola for Los Angeles Opera. For the Metropolitan 'Guiletta' in The Tales of Hoffmann, as well as the title roles in La Cenerentola and Italiana. She gave her Chicago Lyric Opera debut as 'Ruggiero' alongside Renée Fleming in Handel's Alcina. In 2001, Miss Larmore gave her Australian debut in a triumphant series of concerts with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Manfred Honeck. European highlights have included Italiana and Carmen at the Vienna Staatsoper and her return to the Bastille in Paris to sing La Damnation de Faust with Seiji Ozawa. Operatic appearances in 2001/02 included 'Sesto' in Mozart's La Clemenza di Tito in Barcelona and Carmen in Washington, 'Hänsel' in Hänsel and Gretel at the MET and in Rome.

Miss Larmore will be performing at the Orpheum Theater on Sunday, July 11, 2004, at 2:30 P.M.

The NATS Intern Program is an exciting and innovative venture that seeks to pair experienced and recognized master teachers of voice with talented young members of NATS. Within a format designed to promote the dynamic exchange of ideas and techniques, the goal is to improve substantially the studio teaching skills of these promising young teachers. Each intern will teach four lessons to two students (one male and one female) and perform in a master class under the supervision of a master teacher. In addition, the master teachers and special guests will present special lectures and demonstrations. Interns chosen will be responsible for their own expenses, although financial assistance will be available through the NATS Foundation for housing. Interns may also request financial assistance from their NATS chapters or regions as well as from their institutions of employment. The interns' tuition expenses for this program are completely covered by NATS, Inc.

Twelve NATS teachers will be chosen to participate in the 2004 NATS Intern Program.

Requirements are as follows:

- An applicant must be a member of NATS in good standing with no more than five years of fulltime teaching or the part-time equivalent. Working as a graduate teaching assistant does not count towards the five-year limit. Holding a Master's Degree or higher is preferable but not required.
- The application must include the completed application form (available in a downloadable version at www.nats.org, in the Fall 2003 Inter Nos, or by mail from NATS, Inc., 4745 Sutton Park Court, Suite # 201, Jacksonville, FL 32224), a résumé, two references, and a recent audio recording (a 15-minute audio CD of your singing with piano accompaniment in three languages including English. If you cannot send a CD, a cassette-taped recording is acceptable). Applicants must not send video recordings.
- All applications must be received by the deadline of February 1, 2004.

AWARDS FOR VOCAL EXCELLENCE

For 2004 Awards

The Awards for Vocal Excellence is a program of voice scholarships sponsored by the National Association of Teachers of Singing offered to qualified four-year colleges, universities, or conservatories with outstanding vocal programs. To be eligible to apply, the institution must meet the following guidelines:

- 1. The majority of voice teachers on the faculty must be NATS members in good standing.
- 2. The undergraduate voice curriculum must include private lessons, singer's diction, pedagogy, song literature classes, opera theatre, and a diversity of performance opportunities.
- 3. The institution must agree to match a Foundation award of \$750 with a like amount in funds or tuition grants.
- 4. The award shall be for one year and shall go to a senior voice major who has at least two semesters remaining before graduation.
- 5. The recipient will be selected by the voice faculty of the institution.
- 6. Applications must come from the dean, chair of the music department, or chair of the voice faculty. *Students are not eligible to apply*.

Note: the Application Deadline for 2004 Awards is February 15, 2004.

Applications must be postmarked by February 15, 2004.

Six Awards will be available this year.

Awards will be made on a "First Come, First Served" basis.

Past winners will not be considered.

The World View



Marvin Keenze, Coordinator of International Activities

My travels in 2003 on behalf of NATS have taken me to Italy, Japan, Norway and France and provided an opportunity to observe the work of ICVT member associations and to communicate our interest in their activities. I have now visited all of the associations at least one time since my appointment to this position. Those of us who have participated in international meetings and conferences have always been welcomed with great kindness and reminded of how much we can learn from each other.

This August, the EUROVOX Congress of the European Voice Teachers Association (EVTA) was held at the Norwegian Academy of Music with the theme VOICE, BODY and SOUL. President Guri Egge and Vice-President Barbro Marklund of the Norsk Stemmepedagogisk Forum (NSF) and their committee had planned a varied program that was international

in scope and gave us an impressive experience of the abundant cultural life and heritage of Norway. NATS member, Elisabeth Howard presented two master classes on modern music styles and techniques. Bjorn Simensen, the general manager of The Norwegian Opera, gave us a preview of the plans for the sleekly elegant Opera House that is in the early stages of construction. A portion of the Oslo harbor is presently being filled in to create a new site with 2008 as the planned completion date. As a member of the French Association, I was appointed a delegate to the EVTA Council meetings and was able to participate fully in the council deliberations. The enthusiastic ICVT6 conference Chair Ingrid Suderman, on behalf of NATS and the Victoria and British Columbia Chapters, officially invited EVTA to the Vancouver conference. There was a warm welcome for the Slovenia Association and for observers from Latvia and Albania. The German Association (BDG) will assume the presidency of EVTA in 2004. NATS members Sylvia McClain (CT) and Marian Steinbergh and Geoffrey Forward (CA) attended the Congress.

JARS, the Japanese Association for Research in Singing, was my host for April meetings in Tokyo and Yokohama. Planned by NATS member Professor Minoru Yamada and Professor Kawakami, I met with teachers and singers for classes in voice pedagogy and technique. Since 1937, continuing education has been an important work of this association and the members have been strong supporters of the ICVT activities.

I was with the Association Françaises des Professeurs du Chant in May and in November at conferences held at the Paris Conservatoire in La Villette. The earlier meeting featured lesser known French song repertoire and sessions on style and performance. The November meeting had sessions on historical voice pedagogy and the work of Manuel Garcia led by NATS member, Michel Hart and AFPC President Armande Olivier, Paolo Zedda's "Hommage a Nicola Vaccaj et presentation de Vocales 2000 de 1833 a 2003", a scientific session on "mixed voice" terminology that encouraged much discussion and controversy and energetic master classes by Elisabeth Howard. The attendance was too large for the venue making it necessary for her to do two sessions. 
