# VOCOLOGY AND THE SINGING TEACHER

## THE VAN L. LAWRENCE FELLOWSHIP AWARDED TO JOHN NIX

The Van L. Lawrence Fellowship was created to honor Van L. Lawrence, M.D. for his outstanding contribution to voice, and particularly to recognize the importance of the interdisciplinary education he fostered among laryngologists and singing teachers. It is awarded jointly by The Voice Foundation and The National Association of Teachers of Singing Foundation.

Candidates for the Van L. Lawrence Fellowship are members of The National Association of Teachers of Singing who are actively engaged in teaching. The Fellowship is awarded to candidates who have demonstrated excellence in their professions as singing teachers, and who have shown interest in and knowledge of voice science. The Fellowship is intended to provide opportunities for the Fellow to become more thoroughly acquainted with practices, techniques, technology and people involved in laryngology and voice science. It is hoped that the opportunities and contacts provided through the Fellowship experience will enhance the teacher's ability to do meaningful interdisciplinary research, and will encourage the teacher to apply appropriate voice science advances in the studio.

This year The Voice Foundation and the NATS Foundation are proud to present the Van L. Lawrence Fellowship to John Nix, MM, ME, Certificate in Vocology. Mr. Nix is an Associate Professor of Voice and Voice Pedagogy at The University of Texas at San Antonio. This \$2,000.00 award will be presented at 3:30 pm on Thursday, June 1, 2006 during The Voice Foundation's 35th Annual Symposium: Care of the Professional Voice in Philadelphia.

Dr. Mabry presented a lecture recital/workshop on extended vocal techniques and a master class on 20th century literature. # The Philippine National Association of Teachers of Singing Samaban ng mga Guro sa Pag-awit

There are 7,107 islands that comprise the Philippines and about 70 million people who inhabit an area a little

larger than New Zealand. English is the official language but one may encounter 111 linguistic, cultural and racial groups who speak Filipino, the national language based on Tagalog. In addition there are 70 languages and dialects that are also spoken. The country's history of Asian, Spanish and American influences have contributed to a rich and varied culture that is evident in architecture, music and language. I visited

Manila in January having been invited to visit four schools, the 400 year-old University of Santo Tomas, the oldest in Asia, St. Scholastica's College, the University of the Philippines and St. Paul's University. All of these outstanding institutions have strong music programs with distinguished faculty members who have

studied in their native country and have had further training in China, Japan, the US and Europe. The superb choirs have been recognized as among the finest in the world.

There was a strong feeling among teachers that this was the time to come together to form a national association. Preliminary communications had been started before my arrival and the first meeting was held on January 16. An eager group of teachers and students met at St. Scholastica's College and formally launched P-NATS. Since that time there has been a second meeting and interest and enthusiasm is growing rapidly. Many of our ICVT colleagues and NATS members sent messages of support and congratulations as P-NATS replaced Iceland's FIS as the newest association. This title was short-lived for when I returned home I received notice that there is now an association in Spain, the ASOCIACIÓN ESPAÑOLA de PROFESORES de CANTO (AEPC). For information there is a web site: www. aepc.com.es. We now have 22 nations represented in the ICVT.

# VOCOLOGY AND THE SINGING TEACHER



UTSA Students Provided Entertainment at Banquet

Once the dust settled from the unexpected (but very welcome) arrival of nearly 30 people who chose to register onsite, the workshop began with a pair of sessions by Dr. Scott McCoy, who presented a multimedia overview of voice physiology and acoustics. Vocology deals with the practical application of voice science to voice training and rehabilitation; McCoy's presentation provided a foundation for the expert sessions that followed and helped establish a common base for understanding. He will repeat these presentations as a Voice Science Primer at the upcoming NATS National Conference in Minneapolis.

Medical aspects of voice were explored in sessions led by Dr. Anthony Jahn, medical director for the Metropolitan Opera, and Dr. Anat Keidar, founder and director of the Keidar Voice Institute. Workshop attendees were provided essential information about the maintenance of vocal health, prevention of vocal disabilities, and rehabilitation from voice disorders. The presenters were extraordinarily generous with

their time and were eager to answer the workshop attendees' questions before, during and after their sessions.

Dr. Christopher Arneson discussed speaking voice issues commonly faced by singing teachers in a lively session that included numerous exercises for freeing the body and voice, and even extended to a brief tutorial and demonstration on proper techniques for stage screaming (no doubt heard all the way to the River Walk!). The workshop concluded with a session by Dr. Stephen Austin, who demonstrated the practical application of Vocology in the singing studio. Dr. Austin drew connections from historical provenance through contemporary research in voice acoustics to further our understanding of registration and other vocal issues.

Special thanks are given to Linda Poetschke, who served as the local coordinator for this event—we could not have done it without her. Linda, together with her colleagues Diana Allen and John Nix from the University of Texas at San Antonio, provided spirited entertainment for the Workshop Banquet. UTSA students and faculty performed cabaret-style from a varied menu of musical appetizers, entrees and desserts. Readers responsible for programming scene recitals might want to consider this innovative approach.

This workshop was my final event as NATS Vice President for Workshops. I would like to extend my thanks to the more than 750 people who attended national workshops during the past four years, and to the numerous presenters who so graciously gave their time and expertise to make these events a success. Our new Workshops VP, Suzanne Draayer, already has some exciting things planned for the future—I hope to see all of you there as our lives continue to be enriched by the NATS program of National Workshops.













