

Several months ago, I read an excellent article about NATS in the August 2004 issue of *Classical Singer magazine*. It was written by one of our NATS members, Dr. Ruth Christensen, who is on the faculty of Brigham Young University, and president of her local NATS chapter. She brought to my attention that some teachers might shy away from joining our Association because they do not understand how their dues dollars are spent. Let me explain a little bit about where your money goes.

Our largest source of income is from member dues. Over the years, we have had to raise dues because of the rising costs of doing business. Additionally, as our total membership grows, expenses increase. Each year, about sixty-seven percent of the Association's revenue comes from member dues, so you can see that as costs rise, membership dues are affected.

The other one-third of our income is derived from such revenue producing items as *Journal of Singing* subscriptions from non-members and libraries; *Journal* advertising; mailing label sales; and other income such as NATSAA entry fees and membership directory sales.

Workshops and conventions are budgeted to be self-sustaining from registration fees. Workshops usually pay for themselves; however, the past three conventions have been partially subsidized from the general fund. For example, the 2004 Convention in New Orleans cut into our projected total budget for 2004 by five percent.

The National Association of Teachers of Singing, Inc. (NATS)

announces the opening of the position of executive director with duties beginning October 1, 2005. During the months of October and November, 2005, the new executive will work with the current director in an orientation period. The full-time salary will begin as of October 1, but the initial title will be that of assistant to the director. On December 1, 2005, the current executive director will retire, and the assistant will become executive director. The executive director is in charge of the Association's executive office which is located at 4745 Sutton Park Court, Suite #201, Jacksonville, Florida 32224. The executive office facilitates the work of the officers of the Association; the regions, districts, chapters, and their programs; and serves the constituency in keeping with the purposes and goals of the association. According to the bylaws the purpose of the Association is "to encourage the highest standards of the vocal art and of ethical principles in the teaching of singing; and to promote vocal education and research at all levels, both for the enrichment of the general public and for the professional advancement of the talented." The executive office currently has a full-time staff of three including the director.

Salary and benefits:

<u>Salary:</u> The salary will depend on the qualifications and experience of the new executive director. Minimum salary is \$50,000 per year plus benefits.

<u>Health benefits</u>: NATS will pay the cost of an individual health insurance policy.

<u>Retirement benefits</u>: NATS will contribute 2% of the annual salary into a simple IRA plan. In addition NATS will invest an additional 5% of the annual salary into a tax sheltered plan of the executive director's choosing.

Qualifications:

Candidates should have training and/or experience in both management and artistic activities and a graduate degree (or equivalent in experience).

Location:

Jacksonville, Florida, is the heart of a metropolitan center of over one million people. It is a friendly and comfortable place – both a river and a coastal community of unique neighborhoods, from luxury condominiums, recently built single family homes and apartments near the NATS office, to other communities with grand historic homes, to custom-built new communities in every style.

Meet these leaders of the BDG in Vancouver



Berthold Schmid is the presdent of the Bundesverband Deutscher Gesangspaedagogen (BDG). He was born in Ravensburg in 1953 and studied at music schools in Stuttgart, Munich, and Freiburg, in the areas of piano, voice, and music education.

Since 1981 he has been a freelance singer and in addition to his classical repertoire in opera, lied, and oratorio, he has been dedicated to the performance of new music and bringing these concerts to the public.

He has made concert tours of Europe, Japan, Korea, Israel, and South America, among others countries, and has been a guest at numerous important festivals. He has been active in radio performances and recordings. From 1989-2003, he was professor at the Musikhochschule in Detmold, and in 2003 he taught at the Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy Hochschule in Leipzig.



Scott S. Swope, baritone, currently serves on the faculty of the University of Osnabrueck and the Osnabrueck Conservatory of Music. He has served as Director of the Early Music Ensemble and the International Chorus, in addition to running the opera scenes program.

He has performed with numerous opera and music companies and made his German debut in Parsifal at the Freiburg Opera House. An avid recitalist, he has specialized in French and American repertoire. He has served as Treasurer of the BDG and is Vice-President of the European Voice Teachers Association, and a Council member of the ICVT. He has been a member of NATS since 2002.



Norma Enns was born and raised in Winkler, Manitoba and has degrees in voice, viola performance and piano pedagogy. After further studies and performances in Germany, she joined the faculty at the University of Music and Theater in Hannover.

In 1994 she became Professor of Voice and Contemporary Music. She is currently the International Coordinator for the BDG and President of EVTA. She is an internationally acclaimed concert singer for oratorio, lied and contemporary music, having sung throughout Europe, Asia, North America, Africa, and the Middle East. She has made recordings for all of the major European radio stations, and recorded numerous CDs. She has been involved in the producing and performing of experimental music and theater and opera projects.

The World View

As we anticipate the 7th International Congress of Voice Teachers Conference, it is a time to remember how the number of associations has been enlarged and strengthened since our first experimental conference in 1987. The excitement that was generated by those days together in Strasbourg continues to inspire our international cooperation and collegiality. Those of you who have been a part of an ICVT conference know that we always have a marvelous time and that it is a rewarding experience. If you have not attended one of these events you should certainly make plans to be in Vancouver, British Columbia, from August 11-15 and see what you have been missing. You will return home having met many new friends and with a broader view of the scope of our work as teachers of singing and voice specialists.

A strong ICVT depends on a strong European Association of Teachers of Singing. There are 14 member associations now in EVTA. The following press release has come to me from secretary, Georges Regner, a member of the Swiss Association (APCS):

More than twenty representatives of eleven European voice teacher associations met in Hannover, Germany on October 2nd and 3rd, 2004 to reincorporate as a registered association under a new constitution. The aim of this process is to legally formalize EVTA as a registered association, thereby giving EVTA a more relevant and representational organizational structure.

The new constitution was unanimously approved and an executive committee was elected to serve a four-year term. The executive officers are: President, Norma Enns and Vice-president, Scott Swope, both of Germany; Secretary, Georges Regner, Switzerland,; Treasurer, Evelyne Koch, France and three members-at-large, Guri Egge, Norway; Maria Chechowska-Krolicka, Poland and Franz Huijts, The Netherlands.

EVTA is an umbrella organization of national associations from throughout Europe. The meeting was prepared by a team from the German Association (BDG), Prof. Norma Enns, Dr. Scott Swope and Prof. Berthold Schmid (president of the BDG). The EVTA Council succeeded in reaching a consensus during two days of intensive and constructive discussions. It was a pleasure to have Paul Deegan, U.K. (AOTOS) present. He was a founding member of EVTA in its original form 14 years ago.

Many EVTA members will join us in Vancouver and you will have an opportunity to meet them. EVTA will convene in Vienna from August 10-13, 2006, as well as at the next ICVT conference.

The *Journal of Singing* is one of the big expense items each year. In 2003, the total amount spent on publishing and mailing the *Journal*, including staffing, was over \$123,000. That represents about twenty-two percent of our total annual expenses. Approximately 1.25% of each dues dollar goes directly as a contribution to the NATS Foundation. About 11% of the dues dollar goes to your region to help fund regional, district, and chapter activities.

Here is how the rest of your dues dollar is spent. Thirty-seven cents of your dues dollar goes directly into programs that serve our members and our profession. This includes the regional allocation mentioned above; production, printing, and mailing costs for the newsletter, *Inter Nos*; maintaining the NATS website, nats.org; the NATS Discretionary Fund Grant Program; workshops; funding for competitions like NATSAA and the Art Song Competition; work with international voice teacher organizations; and the NATS Intern Program.

Administrative costs consume eighteen cents of every dues dollar. This goes to pay for insurance, including liability insurance for chapter, regional, and national meetings; office supplies; office rental; various services and equipment purchases; corporate expenses; postage and shipping; and printing.

Twenty-three cents of your dues dollar goes to office staffing, employee benefits, and taxes; and twenty-two cents of your dollar goes to the producing, printing, and mailing the *Journal of Singing*. This includes payments for services of the editor and advertising director.

I hope this explanation will promote a better understanding and appreciation of what your dues dollar accomplishes toward the fulfillment of our mission "to encourage the highest standards of the vocal art and of ethical principles in the teaching of singing: and to promote vocal education and research at all levels, both for the enrichment of the general public and for the professional advancement of the talented."

CALL FOR NOMINEES FOR NATIONAL OFFICE DEADLINE: February 1, 2005

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Teachers of Singing, Inc., I hereby issue an invitation to all NATS members, chapters, districts, and regions to submit nominations for the national offices that will be open as of July 2006. These offices include those of President Elect, Vice President for Workshops, Vice President for NATS Artist Awards, Vice President for Discretionary Funds and Field Activities, and Secretary/Treasurer. Reelection for a second term is permitted under our bylaws. The membership will also be asked to vote on the re-election of Vice President for Membership Karen Peeler who is currently in her first term of office. By calling for these nominations, it is the hope of the Board of Directors that the National Nominating Committee will be able to consider several worthy candidates for the five offices that will be open. Current President Elect Martha Randall will become President in 2006 and current President Jane Dillard will become Past President that same year. The process for making nomination is as follows:

- 1. Submit the name and contact information, professional résumé, qualifications for the office, and NATS organizational experience of the nominee. It is strongly suggested that nominees for President Elect have past or present experience as a member of the NATS Board of Directors. Be sure to obtain the permission from the potential candidate to submit his or her name to the committee and assurance that he or she is willing to serve for the two-year term of office if selected to run, and if elected by the membership. The candidates for President Elect must be willing to serve three two-year terms as President Elect, President, and Past President, for a total of six years.
- 2. Include the names of those in your chapter, district, and/or region who support the submitted nomination so that committee members may contact these people for further information about the suggested nominees.
- 3. Send these materials to *Roy Delp, Chair, NATS Nominating Committee, 1312 Lemond Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32308-0720,* by February 1, 2005.

The National Nominating Committee (Roy Delp, Lorna MacDonald, Richard Miller, Julie Simson, and Clifton Ware) will select one candidate for each open office, subject to approval at the 2005 NATS Board of Directors meeting. Prior to the election, the slate of candidates will be published in *Inter Nos* and *NATS Online*. Your participation in this nominating process is an essential part of electing national officers who truly represent the membership.







